




I put together a step by step pictured diagram that shows how I made one of my favorite homemade tools which I use every time I do a brake job.

Let's make Macgyver proud!





AMERICA'S BEST SCHOOL BUS TECHNICIAN—STATE COMPETITION



Dear Mr. Harmon,

The Ohio State Highway Patrol Licensing & Commercial Standards Section is currently going through a transition to put more officers on the road. You will begin to notice less enforcement officers during bus inspections and more Highway Patrol civilian inspectors. However, there will be no change in the services provided during the annual and spot inspections of each school district.

This process will in no way reduce the involvement of the Highway Patrol; in fact, it will improve direction and communication. It is our intention to replace previous trooper involvement with management command and control. You will continue to have state troopers involved; however, these state troopers will be sergeants and lieutenants. These commanders have always been available, but the school districts will begin to see them more often.

Again, for this year, annual inspections can begin in January at the request of the school districts. If there is a bus garage that wants to have their annual inspections completed prior to the "typical" times of May through July, they need to contact their local bus inspector to set up a date that is convenient.


