


I'm sure everyone is excited for Annual Inspections this year. With changes going on at the State Patrol, some of us have already been inspected and stickered. For those still getting their fleets ready, here is an easy way to put a smile



on your Inspector's face and extend the life of your exhaust system. I have been using a Primer Sealer on all of our buses for the past three years. I use it on the entire system-tubing, clamps, hangers, mufflers. etc.

I use 2 cans of Primer Sealer on each bus. Most auto stores sell this. I get it at NAPA for around \$4.50 per can. (I tried it by the gallon in my paint gun, but the air hose and size of the gun was too big to get up in some of the tight spots. The can seems to work the best.) That's \$10.00 per bus and we all know how much 4 inch exhaust is—not cheap. It seems to always rust at the clamp. This sealer slows down that process.

After using the Primer Sealer, if there are any small leaks, they will show up black, which is an easy way to be sure your system is sealed properly. Unless your entire system is stainless steel, we will always deal with rust. Putting this Primer Sealer on will extend the life of your exhaust and components. The Inspectors love to keep that white glove clean, and after seeing all the painted exhaust with no leaks they will be smiling from ear to ear (at least our inspector was)!



The OSBMA has many Mechanics with Years of experience. Feel free to send me any tips or tricks that you have learned along the way. There are many new Mechanics that would appreciate some new knowledge.

Promoting Safe and Efficient Pupil Transportation in Ohio!

HOW TO CHANGE YOUR OIL

Women:

- 1. Pull up to Jiffy Lube when the mileage reaches 3000 since the last oil change.
- 2. Drink a cup of coffee.
- 3. 15 minutes later, write a check and leave with a properly maintained vehicle.

Men:

- 1. Go to parts store and write a check for 50 dollars for oil, filter, oil lift (AKA kitty litter), hand cleaner and scented tree.
- 2. Discover that the used oil container is full. Instead of taking it to recycle, dump in hole in back yard.
- 3. Open a beer and drink it.
- 4. Jack car up. Spend 30 minutes looking for jack stands.
- 5. Find jack stands under kid's pedal car.
- 6. In frustration, open another beer and drink it.
- 7. Place drain pan under engine.
- 8. Look for 9/16 box end wrench.
- 9. Give up and use crescent wrench.
- 10. Unscrew drain plug.
- 11. Drop drain plug in pan of hot oil; get hot oil on you in process.
- 12. Clean up.
- 13. Have another beer while oil is draining.
- 14. Look for oil filter wrench.
- 15. Give up; poke oil filter with Phillips screwdriver and twist it off.
- 16. Beer.
- 17. Install new oil filter making sure to apply thin coat of clean oil to gasket first.
- 18. Dump first quart of fresh oil into engine.
- 19. Remember drain plug from step 11.
- 20. Hurry to find drain plug in drain pan.
- 21. Hurry to replace drain plug before the whole quart of fresh oil drains onto floor, Slip with wrench and bang knuckles on frame, Begin cussing fit, Throw wrench, Clean up; apply Band-Aid to knuckle.
- 22. Beer.
- 23. Beer.
- 24. Dump in additional 4 quarts of oil.
- 25. Lower car from jack stands.
- 26. Accidentally crush one of the jack stands.
- 27. Move car back to apply more oil lift (AKA kitty litter) to fresh oil spilled during step 21.
- 28. Finally finished!
