

TIPS & TRICKS



Here is a quick and easy way to remove rusted screws or bolts. When I first started replacing these Warning Light Housings I probably broke 2 or 3 nice screwdrivers because of these rusted screws. Vice-grips were too big to get a bite on them and I did not want to have to drill each one out.

So I went and got one of the handiest persuasion tools I own... **The Air Chisel.** This tool works wonders for lots of different jobs. I'm sure most of you would agree.

Just a little hammer on each side of the screw and shizzam even the rustiest stripped out screw will back out with ease!

On a side note: The Inspectors keep an eye on faded Amber and Red covers, so changing the whole housing, if needed, will save you time down the road. Also, once you have your Backing Plate removed, this is a great time to paint the background black again, as that area will fade over time as well.


