

America's Best School Bus Technician

The Ohio School Bus Mechanics Association is planning on sending a representative to the 2017 School Bus Technician's Training and Skills Competition. The test will be administered at the 2017 OSBMA Spring Workshop to be held April 4, 2017 in Columbus, Ohio. This test will be similar to the typical ASE test with 50 questions. The top score will represent Ohio in the America's Best School Bus Technician's Training and Skills Competition.

The Ohio School Bus Mechanics Association will provide transportation to the contest, lodging and breakfast for the technician. Any other persons traveling with you will need to cover their own costs. Information regarding the national competition will be posted on the NAPT website as soon as details are finalized (www.napt.org).

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TIPS & TRICKS



Rust, Rust, Rust! I guess it is job security. Here is a great way to install the entry door glass after replacing the lower metal portion of the door. I actually learned this from talking with a fellow Mechanic at the Fall Workshop in Columbus. Chuck Childress, from Akron Public Schools, told me how he installs the glass, which works much better than the way I was doing it!

When you're ready to install the glass, take a flexible, smaller gauge wire or string and run it in the groove of the rubber molding all the way around until each end is at the top and cross each other as shown in this picture.



Take the glass and set it against the inside of the door in place so that the two ends of the wire are at the top and hanging out the front door.



Holding the glass in place, begin pulling out on either end of the wire in the opposite direction it was wrapped. As you can see in the picture to the left, the rubber molding will move right into place as the wire is being pulled out all the way around the molding.




THE NORTHWEST REGIONAL WORKSHOP @ PATRICK HENRY LOCAL SCHOOLS—JANUARY 17, 2017.

OSBMA Goals


- To improve, promote and develop the professional status of school bus mechanics throughout the state of Ohio.


