

I remember (years ago) the first time I had a driver tell me their horn didn't work. I went out, honked the horn, and it worked just fine. Crazy driver right? Well maybe they weren't crazy. It seems to be an issue when the wheel is in a certain position. After doing some further research, I was able to find the culprit. The Horn Brush Assembly had worn down and would not always make contact with the Cancellation Contact Plate on the back of the steering wheel.

So here are a few pictures of removal. Start with removing the steering wheel (fig.1). Once removed, you can see the brass colored cancellation contact plate (fig.3). That just pops off to replace. Next, remove the upper and lower steering column shroud (fig.4). You will see a metal bracket that holds the Horn Brush in place (fig.5). Remove that bracket. Now you can remove the Horn Brush from the bracket and reinstall all parts. Figure 7 shows the old verses new Horn Brush. You can see how it has worn all most completely gone.


