

TIPS & TRICKS

It's that time of year again. The bus garage just got a whole lot quieter!

It's summertime and most of our buses are sitting for 3 months. This time frame can be hard on any vehicle, so here are a couple tips to help protect your fleet.

I like to start off by fueling the buses up. I add a summer fuel additive and top them off. Don't over fill them though, or you will have fuel expand from the overflow in the hot weather. I feel like if they're full of fuel there is less chance to have moisture condense to water in the tank. Plus diesel has a shelf life twice as long as conventional gasoline.



I also keep the DEF level around 20%, and then top it off with fresh fluid before school starts back up. The shelf life of this fluid is about 12 months if stored between 68 degrees and 23 degrees Fahrenheit. Sunlight is no good for this fluid. Anything above 86 degrees will start to decompose this fluid making it harmful for the vehicle. And lets be real, these buses are sitting out in the HOT weather all summer.

This may sound weird, but I still have a few buses that have a straight tail pipe (no turn down). I have to plug the tail pipe to keep the barn swallows from building a nest all summer long. Don't get me wrong, it's pretty cool to start a bus up and watch a huge bird's nest get blown out the tailpipe, but I don't need anything making babies in there!


